How We Began

"Despise Not the Day of Small Things"

It was a small beginning in January, 1917, as twelve believers, desirous of a deeper experience

with the Lord, met together in

their homes to pray. The leader of the group was a young layman, Edwin C. Conrad, from the 12th Street Baptist Church of Allentown. Prayers for the salvation of friends and relatives were answered, and attendance increased to the point that a building was needed to house the growing congre-

gation. With a congregation of 35, 3 building lots and a \$1,000.00 bank account, they contacted a builder, organized officially as the Pentecostal Prayer Band—Assembly of God, and started on their way. Ground-breaking was held on June, 1922, with dedication services on January 21, 1923. Rev. Joseph Tunmore, Superintendent of the Eastern District Council of the Assemblies of God was the dedication speaker.

The Prayer Band, founded upon the Pentecostal experience as described in Acts 2:4, became the first church in the area to preach that the infilling of the Holy Spirit still occurred in accordance with the passage of Scripture.

Senior Pastors of Calvary Temple

Our First Senior Pastor, Edwin C. Conrad ministered from 1917-1953. With a total of thirty-six years not only was he was the first senior pastor he was also the longest in ministry.

Our Second Senior Pastor, Rev. David Berquist ministered from 1953-1960: a total of seven years.

Our Third Senior Pastor, Rev. Albert Skymer ministered from 1960-1963: a total of three years.

Our Fourth Senior Pastor, Rev. Chester Jenkins ministered from 1963-1987. With a total of twenty-four years he was the fourth senior pastor and the second longest in ministry.

Our Fifth Senior Pastor, Rev. Linwood Wells ministered from 1987-1992: a total of five years.

Our Sixth Senior Pastor, Rev. David Ellis ministered from 1992-2005 a total of fourteen years.

Our Seventh Senior Pastor, Rev. Vep R. Ellis ministered from Jan 2006-Jan 29, 2009: a total of three years.

Our Eighth and Current Senior Pastor, Rev. Ray A. Ricketts, began ministering from January 6, 2010 -
